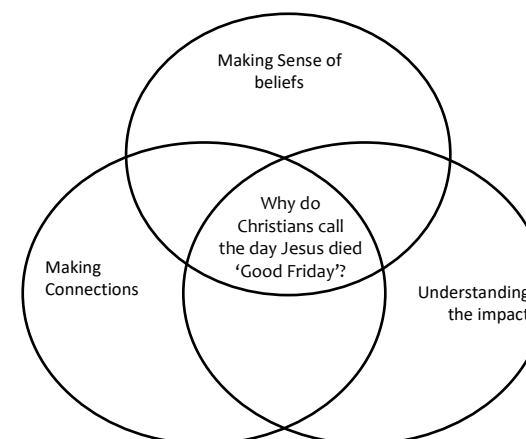

What should I already know?
<p>I will already have learnt about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Christians believe in one God, but they believe he exists in three parts. These are the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, known collectively as the Trinity. Christian belief that Jesus (the son) is God in the flesh. The 'Gospels' are the life and teaching of Jesus. Christians believe that Jesus' life was part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.

What should I know by the end of the unit?
<p>Make sense of beliefs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recognise the word 'Salvation', and that Christians believe Jesus came to 'save' or 'rescue' people, e.g., by showing them how to live. Offer informed suggestions about what the events of Holy Week mean to Christians. Give examples of what Christians say about the importance of the events of Holy Week. <p>Understand the impact:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make simple links between the Gospel accounts and how Christians mark the Easter events in their communities. Describe how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus in worship in different ways. <p>Make connections:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Raise thoughtful questions and suggest some answers about why Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday', giving good reasons for their suggestions.

What will I learn about?
<p>I will learn about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Christian belief that humans are separated from God because of sin. Jesus came to show people how to live God's way. The term salvation. The story of Holy week: Palm Sunday Good Friday Jesus' death Easter Sunday Emotions linked to the events and possible interpretations and the importance that may be attached. How churches celebrate the different days of Holy Week with their communities. The role hope, sadness and joy play in the Easter story and in people's lives today.

How do these ideas work together?



Key Vocabulary	
Holy Week	In Christianity, this is the week just before Easter. Jesus The son of God
Palm Sunday	The Sunday before Easter, on which Jesus entered Jerusalem, riding on a donkey.
Good Friday	The Friday before Easter Sunday. The day in which Jesus was crucified on the cross.
Easter Sunday	A day celebrated by Christians worldwide. The day in which Jesus rose from the dead.
Sin	To commit an act or behaviour which offends God.
Salvation	Being saved from harm or ruin.
Crucifixion	Crucifixion is a method of punishment in which the victim is tied or nailed to a large wooden beam and left to hang, until they are exhausted or die.
