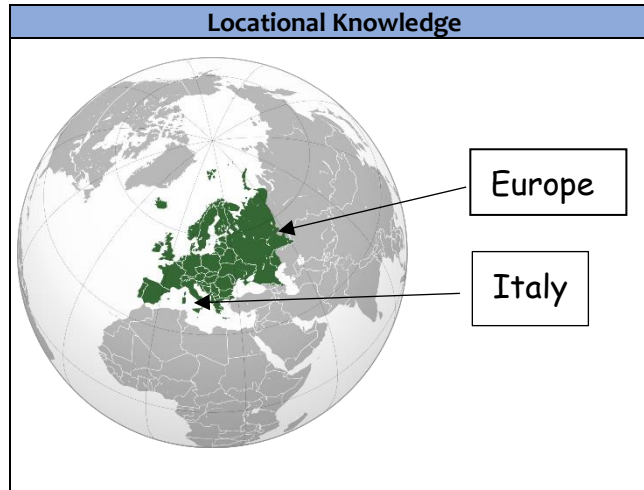

Key Vocabulary	
physical features	Natural features such as rivers, hills and coasts.
mountain range	a series of mountains that are connected together to form a long line of mountains
river	A large natural stream of water flowing in a channel from the source to the sea, a lake or another river.
tourism	people traveling for fun
region	An area that is larger than a county but smaller than a country.
land use	How the land is used e.g. for housing, farming, recreation...
capital city	The most important city in a country.
