What should I already know?

- Describe how Christians show their beliefs about the Holy Spirit in worship.

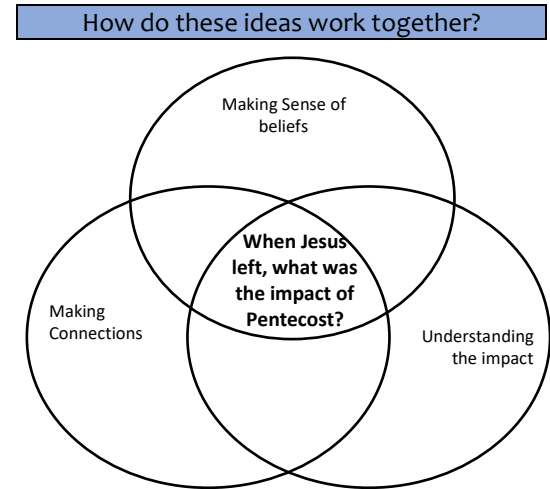
Make connections

- The way Pentecost is celebrated as the Church’s birthday.

Key Vocabulary	
Resurrection	Bringing something or someone back from the dead. Christians believe Jesus was resurrected.
Ascension	The ascent of Christ into heaven on the fortieth day after the Resurrection.
Disciple	A personal follower of Christ during his life.
The Holy Spirit	God’s power in action, his active force. The third person of the Trinity.
Pentecost	The Christian festival celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus after his Ascension, held on the seventh Sunday after Easter
The Holy Trinity	The Father (God), Son (Jesus) and Holy Spirit.
Kingdom of God	The kingdom of God is the realm where God reigns. It is not an actual physical place.
Multilingual	The speaking of many languages.
