



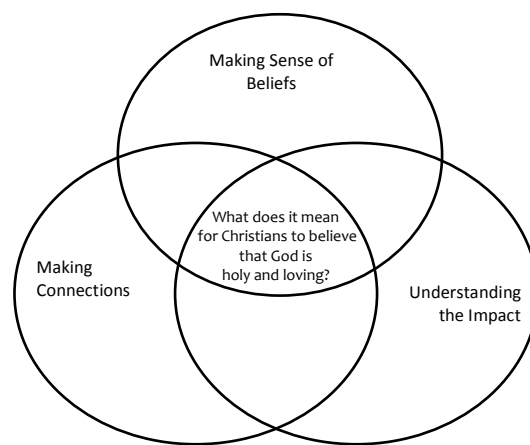

What should I already know?

- Christians believe in one God. They believe that God is: God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- Christians try to follow God's path, as they see it in the Bible or through Church teachings.
- Christians sometimes worship through song and prayer.
- Christian religious buildings include churches and cathedrals.

- I will learn about:**
- What a divine being might be like.
 - Christian beliefs about God, using a selection of Bible texts such as: Psalm 103, Isaiah 6: 1-5 and John 4: 7-13.
 - Christian worship songs and how they emphasise the ideas of God's holiness and/or love.
 - How different parts of a cathedral express ideas about God as holy and loving.
 - Explore and identify the difference between God being holy and God being loving for Christians.
 - Why it is important for Christians that God is both loving and holy in the world today.
 - People having different views and guidelines and how this makes a difference to them.
