 - Examples of how Muslims put their beliefs into action (e.g., prayer, fasting, celebrating).

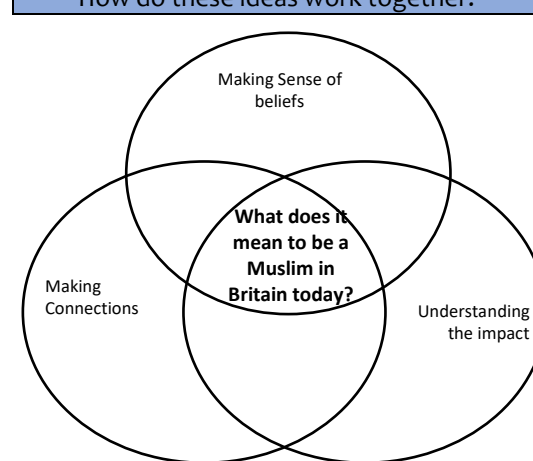

- Muslims in Britain and Gloucestershire today.
 - The Five Pillars as expression of ibadah (worship and belief in action).
 - Hajj (pilgrimage): what happens, where, when and why.
 - The value and challenge for Muslims of following the Five Pillars. How these Pillars affect the lives of Muslims, moment by moment, daily, annually, in a lifetime.
 - The festival of Eid-ul-Adha
 - How Muslims put the words of the Qur'an and the words and actions of Prophet Muhammad into practice e.g. voluntary charity, respect for guests, being truthful and trustworthy.
 - The design and purpose of a mosque. How and why the architecture, artwork and activities reflect Muslim beliefs.

Key Vocabulary	
Allah	The Arabic name that Muslims use for God.
Five Pillars of Islam	The five things that Muslims are expected to do.
Prophets	Special messengers sent from Allah.
Muhammad	The last prophet and the key prophet in Islam.
Mecca	Mecca is an important place to Muslims. It is where Muhammad was born. Muslims face Mecca to pray and try to visit it sometime during their lives.
Pilgrimage	A journey to a special place of religious meaning.
Hajj	The name Muslims give to the pilgrimage to Mecca.
Ibadah	Worship
The Qur'an	The holy book of Islam.
Mosque	Muslim place of worship.
Eid-ul-Adha	'Festival of Sacrifice' is one of the most important festivals in the Muslim calendar.
