### Key Vocabulary

<b>fact</b>	Something that is true.
<b>opinion</b>	Someone's view or judgement.
<b>biased</b>	An account that is unfairly prejudiced for or against someone or something.
<b>unbiased</b>	An account which shows no prejudice.
<b>voluntary</b>	Done, given, or acting of one's own free will.
<b>community</b>	People who have some things in common, such as place, norms, religion, values, customs or identity.
<b>pressure group</b>	A group that tries to influence policy in the interest of a particular cause.
<b>action group</b>	A group formed to campaign politically in the interest of a particular cause.
<b>saving</b>	Keeping money.
<b>interest</b>	Money paid back to a lender as payment for a loan.
<b>tax</b>	A compulsory contribution to state revenue, paid from workers' income or added to the cost of some goods, services and transactions.
<b>environmental sustainability</b>	Conserving natural resources by making particular lifestyle choices.
