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**What should I already know?**

I will already have learnt about:

- Jesus told many parables about the kingdom of God.
- The parables suggest that God’s rule has begun, through the life, teaching and example of Jesus, and subsequently through the lives of Christians who live in obedience to God.
- Many Christians try to extend the kingdom of God by challenging unjust social structures in their locality and in the world.

- Explain connections between biblical texts and the concept of the kingdom of God.
- Consider different possible meanings for the biblical texts studied, showing awareness of different interpretations.

- Show how Christians put their beliefs into practice in different ways.

**Make connections**

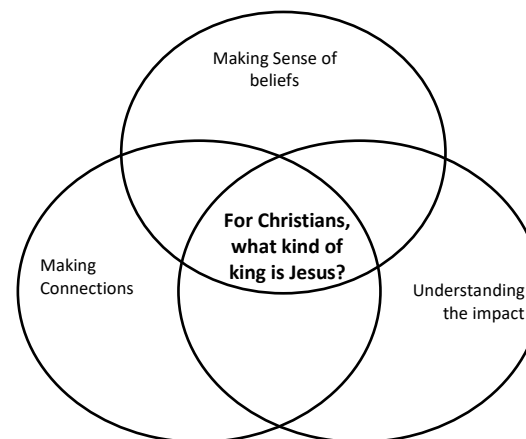
- Relate the Christians ‘kingdom of God’ model (i.e. Loving others and serving the needy) to issues, problems and opportunities in the world today.
- Articulate their own responses to the idea of the importance of love and service in the world today.

**What will I learn about?**

**I will learn about:**

- Transforming the world through action. People who made a difference e.g. winners of Nobel Peace Prizes.
- Jesus as a different kind of king by reading about his ‘temptation in the wilderness’ in Luke 4:1-13.
- The kingdom parables to find out what the kingdom of God is meant to be like. How Christians try to make the world more like the kingdom of God by exploring local and current examples of faith in action.
- Jesus’ idea of kingship includes serving others, particularly those who are in need.
- The role service and love play in the world today.
- Models of leadership.

**How do these ideas work together?**



Key Vocabulary	
Parable	A simple story that Jesus used to get a message across.
The Old Testament	The first part of the Christian Bible and comprises of 39 books. It tells the story of God’s plan to save humanity.
The New Testament	The second part of the Bible, which tells the stories of Jesus’s teachings and his earliest followers.
Kingdom of God	The kingdom of God is the realm where God reigns supreme. It is not related to space, wealth or politics.
Transform	To change something or someone, especially so that that thing or person is improved,
Temptation	To desire to do something, especially something wrong or unwise.
Service	To focus and help others.
Vulnerable	Someone in need of care, support or protection.
